General Resolutions

- The Kentucky Soybean Association recommends the promotion of Kentucky soybeans and soybean products as its primary purpose.
- We welcome soybean policy recommendation from any farm group or soybean producer. Recommendations will be considered during the Annual Meeting.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association endorses and supports the National Checkoff administered by the United Soybean Board.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association urges soybean producers NOT to petition for a soybean referendum.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports the American Soybean Association as the voice for the Kentucky Soybean Farmer for Federal Policy.
- To encourage continuing trust and transparency, the Kentucky Soybean Association engages in independent audits and strongly urges the American Soybean Association, the United Soybean Board and the United States Soybean Export Council to do the same.

Farm Safety

- The Kentucky Soybean Association stresses ON FARM SAFETY especially around equipment, grain storage facilities, chemicals and livestock.

Government

- Future farm bills should be written in a timely manner and any regulatory rules should be easier to comprehend.
- As domestic fertilizer manufacturers decrease in number and foreign manufacturing increases, we support the elimination of the import tariff for fertilizer in order to reduce U.S. crop production costs.
- Because of current conditions and the increasing demand for feed, fuel and food; the Kentucky Soybean Association opposes any state or federal programs that encourage land to be

removed from crop and livestock production.

- We, as soybean producers, oppose embargoes and government manipulation of all commodities markets except in the case of a national emergency or declaration of war.
- We oppose Waters of the US (WOTUS) and recommend that the Natural Resources Conservation Service should be the designated expert in matters of wetland determinations, examination, appeals, and enforcement. Establishing and enforcing policies on the environment should be addressed by Total Quality Management (TQM). Local committees should be empowered to evaluate conflicts and administer decisions at the lowest levels.
- We suggest that the local Farm Service Agency (FSA) offices have more authority on decisions at the local level.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association opposes any River Authority or Corp of Engineers raising lock walls or controlling flood levels without consultation with the respective local agriculture communities.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports and encourages "Trade Promotion Authority" to be extended or renewed for trade negotiation.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports Free and Fair Trade and urges passage of pending free trade agreements.
- We support state and federal legislatures strengthening eminent domain laws to protect private property from personal or commercial economic gain.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports the permanent elimination of all inheritance tax, for the preservation of the family farm.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports the relaxation of weight limits for farm commodities on all federal and Kentucky highways.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports continued funding for lock and dam modernization.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association opposes any climate change legislation that negatively impacts agriculture.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association opposes any legislation that would restrict, prohibit, or limit the modern production of livestock, poultry and aquaculture.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association encourages government to get its work done in regular session therefore not having to return for a special session.

- We as soybean producers encourage USDA to approve seed and crop protection traits in a timely manner in order to control pests and open new markets to give US farmers an advantage.
- Farmers should not be forced to pay any fee to the Farm Service Agency because of error/implementation issue brought forth by staff.
- We support maintaining current sales tax exemptions on farm inputs, building materials, equipment and utilities.
- We support that RMA/Crop Insurance yields be used for ARC-County payments rather than NASS county yields. In addition, we support the creation of base acres for land that has come into production over the past several years.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports the Pass-Through Deduction.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association strongly opposes state budget cuts that will drastically reduce or eliminate agriculture industry support programs, organizations and universities.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports changing the Farm Service Agency July crop reporting date to July 22nd from July 15th.

Energy

- KSA Supports the continuation of the Renewable Fuels Standards set forth by congress. We support increased volume requirements of all renewable fuels.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association strongly encourages the continuation of the federal biodiesel tax credit and encourages Congress to make the tax credit permanent.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association strongly supports renewable fuel use throughout the Commonwealth through the following five incentives which are our guidelines for legislation.
 - a. Kentucky State Government leads by example: all state agencies will use minimum of 20% biodiesel blend in both stationary and transportation applications. The State Emergency Energy Plan should include the use of Biodiesel as an option in response to an energy supply disruption.
 - b. Support the production of existing biodiesel plants and the construction of any future biodiesel plants in the Commonwealth.
 - c. Require that all diesel powered state government on and off road vehicles and equipment utilize a minimum B20 blend.
 - d. Preference to state contractors that use biodiesel for state projects.
 - e. Establish biodiesel on state fuel contract.

- The Kentucky Soybean Association strongly encourages the congress and president's administration to create and implement an energy policy with a strong emphasis on biofuels.

Cooperation

- We recommend that the Kentucky Soybean Association continue to work with all state farm organizations where areas of mutual benefit exist.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association wishes to thank NK Brand Seeds, Ag Venture, LG Seeds, Mycogen Seeds, Seed Consultants, Inc., Beck's Hybrids, Stine, Caverndale Farms Brand Seed, Progeny, Southern States – Owensboro, Dyna-Gro Seed, Syngenta Seeds, Stewart, NuTech Seed and Farm Credit Mid-America for their support of our membership program.

- We encourage all seed companies to adopt 140,000 seeds per unit to enable economic comparison.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association encourages makers of the new dicamba formulations to increase their investments in and recognition of national and state association, academic institutions and state departments of agriculture for their efforts to ensure new innovative technologies are available for growers to combat weed resistance issues.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports the State Fair Board and management in their efforts to make the State Fair the pride of Kentucky's agriculture, industry and natural resources. We encourage the Kentucky State Fair Board be composed of a minimum of fifty percent voting members who are active members in agriculture leadership. We support funding for the expansion and maintenance of facilities at the Kentucky Exposition Center. We urge the Kentucky General Assembly to assume the remaining debt service on capital expenditures at the Kentucky Exposition Center and for the funding to be taken from the general fund. We will cooperate with all interest groups in efforts to maintain an educational State Fair free from political interference with continuity of competent management. For efficiency and effectiveness, we support the Kentucky State Fair Board maintain its independence as a state agency as provided in KRS 247.
 - We support participation in local fairs to encourage good local entries to participate in the State Fair.
 - We support state funds for the continued upgrading of county fairs and encourage the legislature to reinstate and fund the County Fair Building Program.
 - All requirements for participating in all shows and fairs should strictly adhere to and all entries should be visually inspected and certified before unloading.
 - We support fair and uniform guidelines and enforcement of animal livestock inspections for shows and fairs and support the proper training for inspectors.

Soy Foods

- The Kentucky Soybean Association strongly supports the development of food soybean production and processing in Kentucky. The Kentucky Soybean Association is committed to supporting and assisting producers in developing this market.

Soybean Rust

- The Kentucky Soybean Association urges the Kentucky Department of Agriculture to work toward obtaining reciprocating agreements with other states for air applications of fungicides.
- We recommend the state and federal government continue their efforts to assist in the detection and management of Soybean Rust within the U.S. and continue Section 18 for pesticides.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports the work of Soybean Rust sentinel plots throughout the south and urges permanent funding for these plots.

Crop Insurance

- The Kentucky Soybean Association should work, where appropriate, to get a later planting cutoff date for crop insurance purposes.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports a specific designation for double crop soybeans for insurance purposes.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association encourages that all crops be insurable in all Kentucky counties.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association strongly urges Risk Management Agency (RMA) to continue Area Yield Protection (AYP) and Area Risk Protection (ARP) policies in Kentucky.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports crop insurance being handled by private companies not the Farm Service Agency.

Soybean Policy

- The Kentucky Soybean Association is opposed to a uniform national loan rate.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association is opposed to all set-asides in the present or future Farm Bill.

- The Kentucky Soybean Association strongly supports the continued use of 50 percent of Phase I Tobacco Settlement Funds for agricultural development.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports the Grain Indemnity Fund.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports the concept of a Livestock Indemnity Fund.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association opposes the Kentucky Department of Agriculture enacting crop protectant labeling that is more restrictive than the EPA label.
- We support a federal grade on any grain sale where the discount reaches the threshold for a quality discount under RMA special provisions of insurance.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports the return of “like kind exchange” for farm equipment.

Education and Research

- We support Kentucky agriculture and environment in the classroom programs.
- Conventional research and development of soybean varieties is important to agriculture to provide the biodiversity and widest availability of varieties. Conventional plant breeding must be maintained.
- We request that more Federal and State funds be made available to the University of Kentucky and regional Universities for soybean production and utilization research.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports research and development of new uses for soybean products.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports producer nominated varieties in the University of Kentucky soybean variety tests each year especially Non-GMO as there is still a viable market in certain areas.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association continues to provide dissemination of Best Management Practices (BMP) through technology transfer at institution and individual levels.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports Kentucky’s best and brightest-the Kentucky 4-H and FFA.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports the approval and use of new seed based technologies for pest and weed management to combat resistance issues.
- In order to provide feed, fuel and fiber to our ever increasing world populations; we support the use of Genetically Modified Organisms (GMOs) and implementation of new technology to meet

these demands.

Domestic Market Promotion

- The Kentucky Soybean Association encourages all rural electrical cooperatives to use soybean oil in all replacement transformers throughout the state.
- The Kentucky Soybean Association supports animal agriculture and will defend livestock producers in the event of attacks based on emotion, rather than sound scientific evidence, by private groups or policy by local, state, and federal governments.
- We support the Kentucky Livestock Coalition and Kentucky Farm Bureau Animal Care Task Force.

Environmental Stewardship

- Kentucky farmers are leaders in sustainable agriculture. We are opposed to regulations that jeopardize livestock and crop production in Kentucky. Sustainability can best be achieved by economic incentives, education, and voluntary best management practices. We encourage cooperation with other agricultural organizations in promoting agricultural sustainability.
- Urban areas and small property owners must be included in all legislation, regulation or rules governing pollution.
- We encourage chemical companies to provide pesticides in returnable containers or other environmentally friendly and/or user-friendly packaging.
- We encourage all producers to follow best crop production management practices and crop protection labels.

Competition Policy

- Competition is essential for production agriculture. The Kentucky Soybean Association opposes any monopolistic activities of grain, crop input, grain transport companies or agricultural equipment manufacturers to manipulate any portion of input or commodity markets.
